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A Master of Religious Education degree from Newman Theological College is now available for teachers in the Archdiocese of Regina through a combination of local course offerings in Regina, online courses, and 2 summer courses on the Newman campus in Edmonton.

This program will take approximately 3 years to complete and consists of ten courses (which are recognized by STPRB for salary purposes) and four teaching projects.

The tuition fee per course is \$690 - \$753 depending on location. Each school division in the Archdiocese offers professional development support funds that can be used towards this program. Please check with your school division for details.

- Letters of reference from two persons qualified to judge the applicant's character and intellectual ability.
- Personal Statement /Letter of intent about why the applicant would like to study for the M.R.E.
