

Treaty Land Declaration:

“I would like to acknowledge that we are in Treaty Four Territory, Traditional lands of the Nehiyawak (Cree), Anishinabe (Saulteaux), and Nakota people. Homeland to the Dakota, Lakota and Metis people.

Why? A land declaration in Canada is officially recognized as an act of reconciliation that involves making a statement acknowledging the traditional territory of the Indigenous people who called the land home before the arrival of the settlers. It's a way of supporting and responding to the TRC Calls to Action.
